REQUIREMENS FOR SCHOOLS

ON ARRIVAL

•	RESERVED PARKING: for 2 mini buses near to the unloading area.	LJ
•	The dressing room, classrooms and workshop spaces have been cleaned, cleared & prepared for the visiting cast	[]
•	Pupils & class teacher have used the Teachers Packs supplied.	[]
•	DRESSING ROOMS: (12 people total) 1 x large classroom sized space for the artists to assemble & prepare.	[]
•	Warm, well lit, at least 12 x chairs and 4 x tables for make up set up around the edge of the room leaving the centre clear	[]
•	Access to toilets and hot water.	[]

PREPARATION:

- On arrival the artists will go to the dressing room/assemble area.
- The equipment & costumes will be unloaded into the appropriate area.
- Workshop leaders will go to the allocated workshop space in preparation for their workshops.
- The Company technician will start setting up the equipment lighting and sound - for the performance.
- The artists begin setting out the costumes and make up in the dressing room area.

THE PERFORMANCE

PERFORMANCE AREA 5 x 5 metres

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•	Ensure that there is clear access from the dressing room to the performance area, if possible without the artists being seen by the audience. Check curtains give a good black out We will need to work on the stage and dressing room area from arrival until departure. If the hall is used for school meals [mid day] we can part set up, store the equipment at the side of the hall during the meal time and bring everything out ready for the performance – 30 minutes minimum required for the final set up.
